M.U. News Spring 2023 From our Diocesan President Deb Lee

Dear MU Member

It is lovely to recall the Commissioning Service of a year ago. So many of you sharing the joy, having a wonderful sing after so long of not meeting or singing and a powerful feeling of "the Spirit is with us". Since then, things might not have gone as we would have wished. Maybe a friend or family member is no longer with you or you don't feel as young as you were.

According to the prophet Isaiah (49 v6), God's chosen people were to be a light to the nations. Personally, and communally, we are charged to live lives that reveal God's glory by making a difference in the world. That is a big challenge but one that chimes with our calling as members of the Mothers' Union.

The end of the first year of the triennium is a time to reflect on what we have done and whether we are being a "light to the nations" and living how God wants us to live. One of the first things that happened was the Mothers' Union re-imagining conference, which was helpful timing. Marion (the new secretary) and I went. We were challenged to consider what needs to happen to keep the good work of the MU going for another 150years as we all get older and struggle to attract younger members. We have adopted some of the ideas in Carlisle diocese. Change is always difficult and can cause upset and distress. While everyone enjoys the fellowship of a branch meeting, we know that some branches and Deaneries are struggling to find folk to take on the admin roles. We will try to support you and your members, if you find yourselves in this situation. Please contact your deanery team, Carole or Helen (the Vice Presidents), Marion or me.

Remember..

"Brothers and sisters, don't get discouraged in doing what is right." — 2 Thessalonians 3:13

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." - Jeremiah 29:11

So lets look to Philippians 3:13 "Brothers and sisters, but one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead". That's not to forget the wonderful Mothers' Union members who have gone before, they are the roots, trunk and branches of our Mothers' Union tree. We have to be the new leaves!

With that in mind we have a couple of exciting things coming up.

Firstly our Bishop James is to be enrolled on Sunday March 12th at 10am, in his Parish Church of St John's, Keswick. Everyone is welcome and you have already been sent a prayer to pray that Sunday (and ask your vicar to include in your own service!). The following Sunday is Mothering Sunday and I am hoping that many of you will have found at least one person to be enrolled on that Sunday, linking the concept of "mothering" with the fact that anyone who agrees with our aims can be a member of MU. We will have launched our website by then, please encourage folk to use it!

Secondly, one of the ideas from re-imagining the MU was to work with like minded organisations. Deaneries were asked to consider who might fit the bill and we have 2 exciting new projects as a result. Milnethorpe with Heversham have linked with Kent Estuary Youth. Calder Deanery has linked with Time to Change, that support people, particularly women, whose lives have met with adversity. We have agreed to jointly fund a caravan at St Bees for AFIA! We will be asking branches to fund raise to buy towels, toys, toiletries and food. Everything else is provided by the site owner. We will hear more about these two projects in the next newsletter and how the members got on with being interviewed by the Kent Estuary Youth! What can your deanery come up with?

By the time you read this it will be Lent, the Psalm for the First Sunday in Lent (Ps 32) "Happy the ones whose transgression is forgiven, and whose sin is forgiven." So I will end with the reminder that you are both loved and forgiven by our Lord.

doubled. Through your help, Mothers' Union has raised over £106,100 for vital projects in South Sudan. The generous donations will be used to run our Literacy and Trauma Healing programme in 48 communities across South Sudan over the next two years.

What are these programmes and how are they run?

The key to effective functional adult literacy programmes is the participatory approach using interactive bible studies and learning activities. Each of the literacy circles contains up to



30 participants and are led by community volunteers trained by Mothers' Union. The MU facilitators use participatory tools to initiate discussion and help bring out the knowledge and skills of the participants, as well as challenge some of the cultural norms whilst learning the alphabet of

their local language and gradually learning to read and write. This approach enables each literacy circle to become a safe place where all participants feel secure and trust each other to share deep and important issues affecting their lives including topics such as, gender-based violence, women's rights, understanding of traditional practices, health, hygiene and household responsibilities. It enables women to use their voice, often for the first time and speak up freely, helping to promote female leadership. This programme also encourages participants to share their experiences of violence, and with the help of their facilitator, take part in trauma healing exercises to help them begin to heal. Already around 70% of participants in the literacy circles feel they now have coping mechanisms as well as being involved in advocacy activities for peace in their communities. This is compared to around 45% participations in other similar programmes.

'I used to feel terrible, went to the doctors and they didn't know what was wrong with me. I had to take Panadol all the time to help me feel a bit better. But since hearing from the GBV Officers that what I'm experienc-



ing might be trauma, this has really helped me to understand that I'm not going mad and that there is a reason for feeling like this.

There are many cards, gifts and books. Also a range of Coronation commemorative items.




